- Created 1964 by initiative 215, Marine Land Act
- Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation
- Name changed to Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) in 2007
- 23 grant programs and categories
- 64 employees, 32 have only worked at RCO
- 3 RCO staff = 86 years combined

- Total investment over \$2.7 billion





Federal Grant Program

Four percent of the amount in Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund (shared with Clean Vessel Act grants).

Includes revenue from:

- Excise taxes on sport fishing equipment, electric motors, and sonar
- Import duties on fishing tackle, yachts, and pleasure craft
- Portion of gasoline tax attributable to motorboats and small engines
- Interest earned on Trust Fund





Eligible Applicants

- Local agencies
- Native American tribes
- Nonprofit organizations
- Private facility operators
- State agencies

Grant Limits

- Tier 1: \$192,086
- Tier 2: \$1,440,645



Applicants may request up to 75 percent in grant funds

25 percent minimum match

Eligible Activities

- Moorage: docks/floats, slips, piers, buoys, gangways
- Utilities
- Breakwaters
- Upland support amenities
 - Restrooms
 - Showers
 - Laundry
- Dredging and Maintenance (limited)

Proration is Required

Launch facilities <u>not</u> eligible






Written Evaluations

Federal Evaluation Criteria

- Tier 1: state competition
- Tier 2: national competition

Compliance Period

 Useful life period for the entire project is based on the longest useful life period identified for one or more capital improvement(s) within the BIG funded project.



2019 BIG Tier 1 Applications

Federal fiscal year 2020 and 2021

- Biennial request for proposals
- Four applications last July requested \$537,816
- Boating Programs Advisory Committee <u>evaluates</u> projects



2019 BIG Tier 2 Applications


Federal fiscal year 2020

- Annual request for proposals
- One application last July requested \$1,440,645
- Boating Programs Advisory Committee <u>reviews</u> projects
- Applications to U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service by early September for national evaluation
