



RCW 53.08.120 (EHB 6329 – 2018)

(c) Any port district may construct any public work, as defined in RCW 39.04.010, by contract without calling for bids whenever the estimated cost of the work or improvement, including cost of materials, supplies, and equipment, will not exceed the sum of forty thousand dollars. A "public works project" means a complete project.

Public Works - Procurement Statute Description:

RCW 39.04.010

All work, construction, alteration, repair or improvement other than ordinary maintenance, executed at the cost of the state or of any municipality, or which is by law a lien or charge on any property therein. All public works, including maintenance when performed by contract shall comply with chapter 39.12 RCW.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Adopted by the Local United States Food Administration for the season of 1918, pertaining to the harvest and threshing of grain.

RULEI

That the local U.S. Food Administration deputize the man in charge of each threshing machine operating to act as their agent, to see that all ways and means be observed, so as to prevent the watte of grain in any manner.

RULE II.

It shall be in his power to direct all men who are working about the machine or on the job of threshing, and see that they give efficient service, and in any event any one is disalyal he shall be reported to the United States Food Administration and dealt with according to the rules laid down by the Government.

RULE III.

It shall be the imperative duty of every man in charge of a threshing machine to see that his machine is in perfect running order before he shall attempt to do any work at threshing and in case he is mable to overred the defects, he is allowed the privilege of seeking sid of the U. S. Food Administrator who will report his troubles to the manufacturer of his machine, and got his troubles adjusted.

RULE I

As it is an order to save grain, the main in charge of the machine and furner are to arrange to have a mast to attack to the cleaning a parend the machine, and also whose needed, to keep the machine running correctly, and not allest bundles to be run over boars and waque; also it is recommended that they shall arrange to have a sufficient number of racks to hand bundles or, which will be built with highly from and a 2 x 4 around edge for the express purpose to save grain.

RULE V.

It is also demanded of the managers of threshing machines to provide cauxes, size not less than 10×14 , to be put under the feeder of the machine and to avoid all leaks; and the men who are pitching to the machine must observe these rules:

- That bundles must be pitched head first into the machine which is the correct way of feeding a machine. Also the bundles must be pitched at a uniform speed, and in no case pile them upon the fander.
- It is demanded by the Government that the fall

RULE VI.

It shall be the duty of the machine man to avoid all waste for the following reasons:

- A. Threshing grain when it is tough (damp and unrips.)
- B. Loss from shuttering in bundle wagons.
- Carelessness in keeping threshing cylinder up to speed, and in adjustment of blower, etc., dull and hent teeth.

- D. Carelessness in feeding bundles or loose grain into the machine.
- Carelessness in allowing grain to leak on the ground around and under the machine and haste in cleaning up at close of operations.
- F. Improper adjustment of contaves and other parts

RULE VIL-Pertaining to Farmers.

Bid Thresholds for Public Works Projects

	Bid threshold		Small works roster		Applicable
Government type	1 craft*	> 1 craft	threshold	Notes	RCW
Port district	\$0 (\$40,000 effective June 7, 2018)		\$300,000		53.08.120

The lower threshold is the amount below which the local government may use any internally acceptable method of awarding small public works contracts. (This method should be defined in policy.)

For projects whose estimated cost is over the statutory threshold and not using the small works roster, the project must be formally bid.





Formal Public Works Bids

- Over \$300,000 Ports (but can be for smaller projects)
- Formal Advertisement
- Bid Bonds*
- Sealed Written Bids
- Public Bid Opening *
- Formal Award by Council/Commission*
- P/P Bonds Required
- Retainage Required

*if required by statute



Public Works Projects Below Bid Limits



- •Three or more informal bids recommended
- No roster required
- No advertisement required
- Bid bonds optional
- •Electronic, Faxed, or Telephone Quotes Allowed
- Informal quote opening(s)
- •P/P bonds required (possible exemptions)
- Retainage required



Small Works Roster Solicitations

- Requests for informal bids
- Notification can be via email, fax, website, etc.
- Informal bids can be written, electronic, fax, telephone, etc.
- Invite informal bids from all contractors in the category/subcategory.
 - Options when less than all contractors solicited





Limited Public Works Projects (Less than \$50K)



- Small Public Works Roster required
- Must solicit at least 3 informal bids or notify all on roster
- •No advertisement required, just notice to SPWR
- Bid Bonds Optional
- •Electronic, Faxed, or Telephone Quotes OK
- Informal Bid Opening(s)
- •P/P Bonds Can Be Waived
- Retainage Can Be Waived







Bidder responsibility criteria (mandatory)



Supplemental bidder responsibility criteria (optional)



Contract is awarded to the lowest responsive bid by a responsible bidder



RCW 53.08.120 was also changed to expressly allow Ports to enter into unit priced contracts.

(3)(a) A port district may procure public works with a unit priced contract under this section or RCW 39.04.010(2) for the purpose of completing anticipated types of work based on hourly rates or unit pricing for one or more categories of work or trades.

- Must be competitively bid
 - Anticipated on a recurring basis
 - Based on hourly rates or unit pricing
 - Business or operational needs
 - Fixed period indefinite quantity
 - Bid using estimated quantities
 - Define how work orders will be released
 - Include minority/woman contractor when possible
 - Award to lowest responsible bidder
- Initial term cannot exceed 3 years
 - Renewable for 1 additional year
- Prevailing wage, updated annually

2019 Legislative Changes:

Contractor training required or 3 years public works experience and 3+ years valid WA business license Eff. July 1, 2019

Small works roster limit remains \$300k for Ports; May waive retainage in rosters. RCW 39.04.155

Eff. July 28, 2019

HB 5958 – Piggyback verifications relaxed

HB 1295 – JOC available to all agencies; work orders increased to \$550k; DB project limit removed; DB eligibility from \$10M to \$2M; evaluation and award criteria changes; others

Effective July 28, 2019
