




Marine Cargo Operations Partnership

Clean Air Strategy





The vision of the Northwest Ports Clean Air Strategy is to phase out emissions from seaport-related activities by 2050, or sooner.

Implementations plans include:

- Sustainable Building Policy
- Transitioning vehicle fleet to electric or plugin hybrid




- 1,100 acres cleaned-up/remediated
