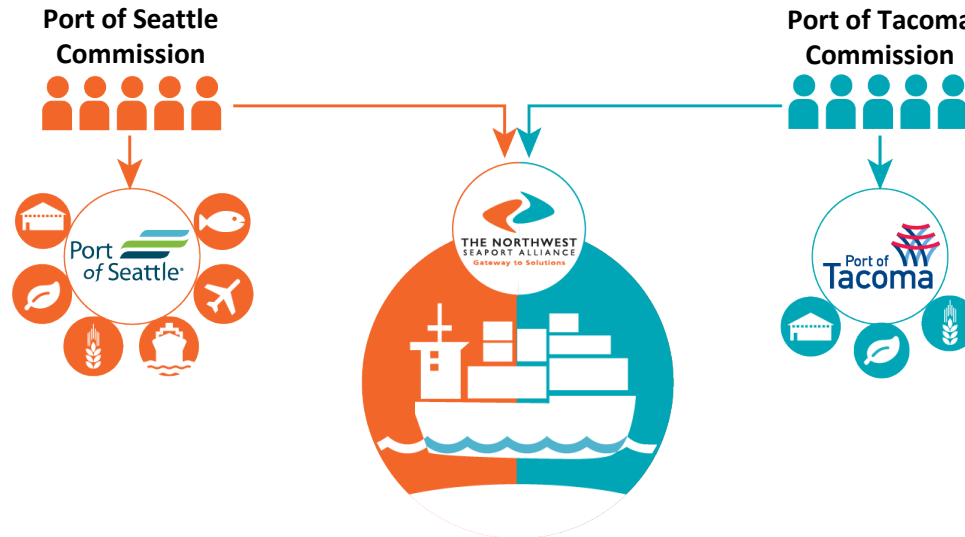

The vision of the Northwest Ports Clean Air Strategy is to phase out emissions from seaport-related activities by 2050, or sooner.

Implementations plans include:

- Expanding shore power infrastructure
- Clean Truck Program
- Electric/hybrid cargo handling equipment
- Sustainable Building Policy
- Transitioning vehicle fleet to electric or plug-in hybrid

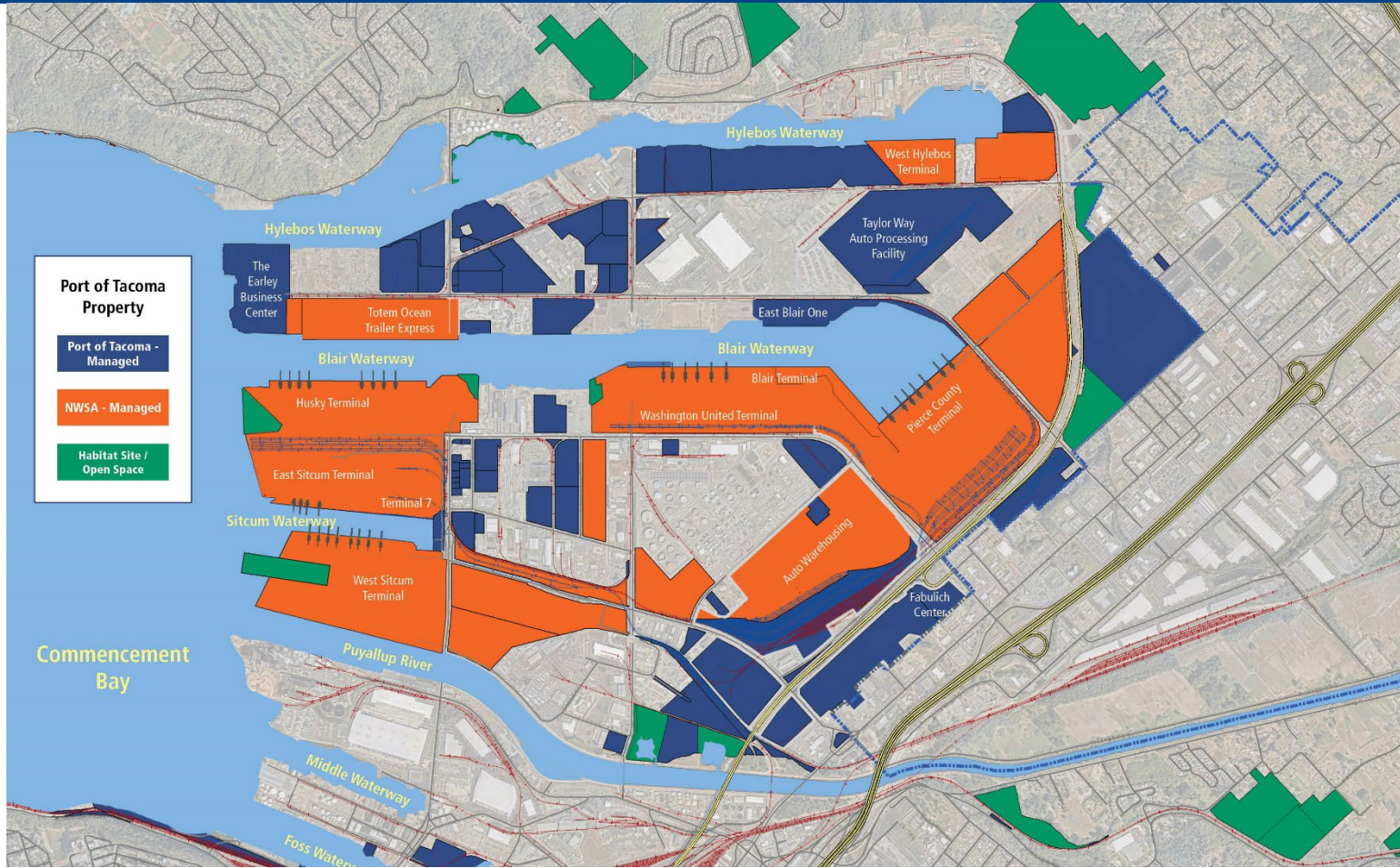


Environmental Program Actions

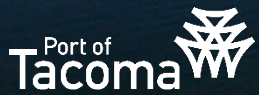
Lower Wapato Creek Habitat Site
