Program Engagements

- WSBO, PWB and CERB have awarded nearly \$270M since 2021
 - 48 projects
 - 60,000 additional connections
- Collaborating with Office of Equity
 - Digital Equity Forum
 - Community outreach
 - Recently sponsored survey regarding impediments to digital equity
- Digital Navigators
 - Investing additional resources with partners to provide devices, subscriptions, technical support services, and skills training (digital literacy, staying safe online, etc.)
 - 22 partners statewide

Program Engagements

Broadband Action Teams

- Partnership with WSU-Ext to develop and facilitate County/Tribal/Regional BATs
- Centralize local broadband conversation to inform WSBO of needs
- Connect user groups and providers to develop project goals.
- Digital Equity Planning funds available for County and Tribal Nations
- \$3M in total and provides down payment on development of local/regional DE plans

• Grant-writing services

• Support to governments, public-private partnerships, and tribal governments to support applications for federal funding

Program Engagements

- Rapid Design Studies (feasibility study)
 - Scope project details, bringing them closer to shovel- and proposal-ready
 - Support for business case development => Sustainability
- Digital Equity Forum
 - Co-convening in partnership with the Governor's Office of Equity
 - Listening to community perspectives and recommendations
 - Access, Affordability, Adoption

Recent NOFO

Schedule

- NOFO was released Nov 22, 2022
- Applications by end of Jan. 23
- Awards targeted for late Feb. 23

• Requirements

- Projects must reliably meet or exceed 100/20 Mbps scalable to 100 Mbps symetrical
- Projects must provide broadband connectivity for a minimum of 25 years
- Requires participation in the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program
- Open Access will not be changed from first NOFO
 - First three years can be "closed" access with OA required afterward
- 10% match requirement as in first NOFO with waiver for distressed counties https://esd.wa.gov/labormarketinfo/distressed-areas






- BEAD program Each State receives a Minimum is \$100M
 - WSBO proposal to NTIA on Aug 11 for \$5M planning grant.
 - Approval granted on Nov. 2022
 - WSBO will develop a state plan by mid-summer 2023 that targets projects for funding
 - Robust public input and community outreach (Digital Equity assessments and BATS)
 - Nationwide BEAD funding is \$42.5B
 - WA share will be based on FCC broadband map Draft Released on Nov 18
- Digital Equity State Planning Grant \$1.1M
 - Receveid funding approve on Nov. 2022
 - Funding will be used to conduct more outreach to create digital equity plan
 - DE Plan will be used in BEAD 5 year state plan

Draft Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Map

- Draft FCC map released on Nov 18, 2022
 - Home | FCC National Broadband Map
- Preliminary Analysis on Map data
 - Unserved WA locations = 166,550 (2.13% of US Total)
 - Preliminary WA Funding estimate ~ \$900M +/-
 - Subject to more analysis and Challenges to Draft FCC Map
- Draft Map Shows:
 - WA Fixed Wireline coverage:
 - Unserved (<25Mbps/3Mbps) = 2.14% (97.86% Served)
 - Underserved (<100Mbps/20Mbps) = 11.43% (88.57% Served)







FCC Map Challenges

Two types of availability challenges to submit by Jan 13, 2023

- Crowdsource Challenge individual submissions to FCC
 - How to Submit an Availability Challenge YouTube
 - WSBO FCC Broadband Mapping website distributed to Counties, Cites, Tribal Nations and Broadband Action Teams (BATs)
 - FCC Consumer Toolkit will be made available for user participation
 - Get the word out to Washington residents!
- Bulk Challenges by WSBO
 - Outreach to public entities and WSU-Extension as facilitator of BATs
 - Utilizing a consultant to assist in developing bulk challenges
 - Bundle challenges and submission by WSBO



Call to action!

- Public participation in FCC Mapping efforts
 - Challenge period ends January 13, 2023
 - State funding assigned June 30, 2023
- How can Public entities help?
 - FCC mapping will be made available to public to check address-level locations and broadband availability
 - Individual users can access map and submit information to FCC if map doesn't represent a user's location or listed broadband availability
 - FCC Consumer Toolkit will be made available for user participation
 - Get the word out to Washington residents!
