WHO WE ARE

- Port District and boundaries formed in 1918; currently serve about 110,000 people
- Governed by three elected commissioners; six-year terms
- Special Purpose District chartered with 'economic development' with end goal of creating jobs

- Support 40,000+ jobs in the region
- Port activities contribute \$433M+ to state & local tax rolls
- Operate three lines of business:
 Seaport, Marina, Real Estate
- Homeport to Naval Station Everett

- Largest public marina on the West Coast
- Everett's customs district ranks 2nd in the state at \$21-\$30 BILLION in exports (including airplanes)
- Srd largest container port in the state
- Designated MARAD Strategic Commercial Seaport – one of only 18 nationwide



The Port District encompasses most of Everett, portions of Mukilteo, and parts of unincorporated Snohomish County in the Marysville/Tulalip area






