Port Commissioner Term Lengths

SUPPORT: SB 5370 would give voters in a port district the option of extending the terms of their commissioners from four years to six years.



Port Districts:

Washington's 75 port districts are independent government entities run by elected commissioners. The number of commissioners and the length of their term can differ from port to port.

Background:

The majority of ports in Washington are run by three commissioners serving six year terms.


